

# Inside Brownwood, TX's, User-Friendly Code Enforcement Software Choice



## Looking Toward the Future

The City of Brownwood, Texas, started using Cloudpermit for online code enforcement at the start of 2023. The staff in the Code Compliance Department wanted to leave behind an outdated system for modernized software.
